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1 Preface

• About this Manual

This manual is designed to assist you in using your new digital camera. Allinformation presented is as accurate as possible but is subject to change without notice.


Camera Buttons

Your camera is equipped with different buttons for ease of use.

Button	Description	
Power	Press to turn on/off the power.	
lmage Stabilizer	The image stabilizer sets the optiomal ISO value according to light levels to compensate for camera shake. Press to set stabilizer.	
Shutter On/ Off	Press to capture an image or start/stop recording video or audio clip.	
Play	If the camera is turned off, press the play button to turn on camera in Playback mode. If the camera is turned on, press to toggle camera to Playback or Record mode.	
Zoom	Press the zoom buttons to change zoom focus.	
Menu	Press to enter or exit the Setup Menu.	
Scene/ Delete In Record mode, press to enter function menu. In Playback mode, press to delete an image, video or audio clip.		

• Navigation Control

The 4-way Navigation Control and the OK button allows you to access the various menus available from the On Screen Display (OSD). You can configure a wide range of settings to ensure maximum results from your photos and videos. The functions of these buttons are as follows:

Operation Sound Your camera is equipped with a speaker for user feedback.

Buzzer	Camera Status	
Two beeps	Denotes the start of an operation like recording and printing. Also beeps when using menu and set properties.	
Three beeps	Denotes low battery and other warning or error message like memory full and card error.	
Continuous beep	Beeps every second for countdown if self-timer is set between 3 to 10 seconds. Beeps every half second if self-timer is set between 0 to 3 seconds. Beep goes off after the countdown.	
Shutter sound	The shutter is pressed to record an image.	

A startup sound can be set when you power on your camera in the sound setting menu. See **"Setting Sounds" on page 77**.

• Camera Memory

Internal memory

Your camera is equipped with 32MB of internal memory. Users can store images up to 10MB. If there is no memory card inserted in the memory card slot, all images, videos and audio clips recorded are automatically stored in the internal memory.

External storage

Your camera supports SD cards of up to 4GB in size. It also supports SDHC cards with a maximum capacity of 32GB. If there is a storage card inserted in the memory slot, the camera automatically saves all images, videos and audio clips in the external storage card. The $+\Box$ icon indicates the camera is using SD card.

3 Getting Started

• Attaching the Wrist Strap

Follow these instructions to attach the wrist strap to your camera to facilitate easy carrying:

- 1. Insert the short loop of the strap in the strap eyelet.
- Thread the larger loop of the strap though the short loop and pull tight to attach the strap to the camera.

• Inserting the Battery

Follow these instructions to insert the Li-ion battery into the battery compartment. Please read **"Battery Information" on page 8** before inserting/removing batteries.

1. Open the battery/SD card door at the bottom of the camera.

2. Insert the battery into the compartment with the terminal facing inside the camera and the battery indent next to the compartment door.









3. Close the battery/SD card door.



• Inserting an SD/SDHC Memory Card

Expand your camera's storage by using SD or SDHC memory cards. Your camera supports SD cards of up to 4GB and SDHC cards of up to 32GB in size.

Follow these instructions to insert the SD/SDHC card.

- 1. Make sure the power is off before inserting a SD/SDHC memory card.
- 2. Open the battery compartment at the bottom of the camera.



3. Insert the SD/SDHC card into the memory card slot with the label side facing up.

4. Push the SD/SDHC card into the memory slot until it clicks into place. *Polaroid t1234 Digital Camera User Guide* 19 www.polaroid.com



5. Close the battery SD/card door.





To remove the SD/MMC card, gently push the card until it pops out. Pull out the the card carefully.

Charging the Battery

The battery that is included in the package is not charged. You need to charge the battery before using the camera.

- 1. Insert the battery into the battery charger as shown.
- 2. Connect the power cord to the battery charger.
- 3. Plug the power cord to the main outlet.

The battery charging time is 2 hours.



Battery icon IIII on the LCD display indicates the battery level. See "LCD Display Layout" on page 24.

• Turning the Power On and Off section

There are two ways to turn on the camera:

- **Press the Power button.** The start up image displays briefly and the startup sound plays if enabled. The zoom lens extends and the camera is turned on in Record mode.
- **Press the Play button.** The camera is turned on in Playback mode. The zoom lens is not extended.

To turn off the camera, press the Power button.

See "Modes" on page 23 to know more about Record and Playback mode.

• Initial Settings

When you turn on your camera for the first time, you will need to set the language and date.

When you turn the Power button on, the Language Menu is displayed on the LCD screen for you to setup the display language.

Setting the Language

- 1. Press \blacktriangle , \bigtriangledown , \triangleleft or \triangleright to move through the selection
- 2. Select a language, then press OK to apply.

Setting the Date & Time

- 1. Press \blacktriangleleft or \blacktriangleright to move through the selection
- 2. Press \blacktriangle or ∇ keys to change the value for the date and time.
- 3. Press OK to apply.

4. If necessary, press m to close the menu.

Now, you are ready to start taking photos and videos.



- Holding down the \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown changes the values continuously.
- If the batteries are removed for more than 48 hours, the Date & Time will have to be re-set.

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Modes

Your camera has two modes: Record mode

- Set to Record mode to capture images and record videos and audio clips.
- Record mode can be further set to mode options like auto, movie and scene selection modes. See "Selecting the Record mode options" below.

Playback mode

 Set your camera to Playback mode to view and edit captured images and playback videos and audio clips. You can also attach voice memo to images in this mode.

When you turn on your camera using the Power button, the camera is automatically set to the Record mode.

Switching between the Record mode and the Playback Mode In the Record mode, press the **Play** button to switch to Playback mode. In the Playback mode, press the Play button to back to Record mode.

Selecting the Record mode options section

Maximize the quality and ease of use of your camera by using the different mode options. The mode options allows you to capture images with preset

settings according to scene conditions.

- 1. Set the camera to the Record mode.
- 2. Press m button to launch the Record Mode.
- 3. Press \blacktriangleright to enter the Record Mode submenu.
- 4. Select a mode.
- 5. Press the **OK** button to apply selected mode.


4 Using the LCD Display

The high resolution 3" LCD display shows important information regarding camera settings as well as the image of your photo or video. The display on the LCD display is called the On Screen Display or OSD.







Changing the LCD Display

The type of information displayed on the LCD screen can be changed using the **OK** button.

Press the **OK** button repeatedly to change the LCD display from one type to another.



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
• Taking Photos section


Now that you are familiar with your camera, you are now ready to take your photos.

Taking photos with your camera is very simple.

- 1. Turn on the camera by pressing the Power button.
- 2. Frame your shot using the focus bracket on the LCD display. See illustration on the right.
- Press the shutter button halfway down. The camera automatically adjusts the focus and exposure. When the camera is ready to take the photo, the frame bracket turns green, the shutter speed and aperture value are displayed.

(When the focus frame turns red and the operation LED blinks,the subject is not in focus. Release the shutter button, recompose thescene and press the shutter button halfway to reset the focus.)





4. Continue to press the **Shutter** button to capture your image. When the shake warning icon $\sqrt[3]{}$ appears, hold the camera steadily, with


your arms at your side or use a tripod to stabilize the camera to prevent blurred images.

NOTE:

¹Use of the flash in the Always ON mode is recommended as well.

• Using the Image Stabilizer

The Image Stabilizer function prevents blurred images caused by shaking. This function is only available if ISO is set to Auto. See **"ISO" on page 38** on how to adjust the ISO settings.



To activate the Image Stabilizer

Press the Image Stabilizer button on top of your camera to enable/disable the image stabilizer. If the Image Stabilizer is enabled, the image stabilizer icon is displayed on the LCD display.



• Setting the Zoom Control

Your camera features up to 3x optical zoom and up to 5x of digital zoom.

- 1. Press the **Zoom** buttons to zoom in or zoom out an image.
- 2. The zoom indicator appears on the LCD onitor. W



Zoom buttons

To adjust the zoom:

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- 1. Press the III button to optically zoom in to the maximum until it stops.
- 2. Release the button.
- 3. Press the D button again to switch to digital zoom automatically. Zooming continues.


• Digital zoom is not activated in recording movies.

• Using Flash

When taking pictures in difficult lighting conditions, use the Flash to get correct exposure. This function cannot be activated when recording movies or continuous shooting.

To activate Flash:

 Press the Flash/Right button on your camera repeatedly until your desired flash mode is displayed on the LCD monitor.



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ISO AUT

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Your camera is equipped with five flash modes:

- **4A** Auto flash. The flash fires automatically whenever extra lighting is needed.
- **Constant Sector** Red-eye reduction. The flash fires twice to reduce the red-eye effect.
- **Always on.** The flash fires whenever you press the shutter button regardless of lighting conditions.
- **4**sL Slow sync. The flash fires with a slow shutter speed.
- (f) Off. The flash is turned off.


• Using Macro


Macro mode is designed for close-up photography. If Macro is enabled, you can capture the detail and sharpness of a very close subject.


To activate macro:

• Press the Macro/Left button of your camera to enable/disable macro.

If macro is enabled, the macro icon is displayed on the LCD display.

• Using the SCN Menu


The Function Menu is used to adjust capture settings in the Record Mode. It contains My Mode, Resolution, Quality, EV Compensation, White Balance, ISO, Metering, and Color Mode.

NOTE:

- Press the SCN button of your camera to launch the Function Menu.
- Press the SCN button again to close the menu.
- The Menu bar displays the current status of your camera settings. Only the available functions for the settings are shown as an icon on the menu bar.
- The available options for each item on the menu bar are shown in the Menu options.
- Use the *◄* or *▶* to move through the menu selections then press the OK button to save and apply changes.

My Mode

The My Mode function displays the 6 most recent modes used in order. When you move through the different modes in the menu options, the items on the menu bar change simultaneously to the corresponding available settings.






Resolution

The Resolution function is used to set the resolution before you capture the image. Changing the resolution affects the number of images that can be stored in your memory card. The higher the resolution, the more memory space is required.



The table below shows the resolution values for still images.



Quality

The Quality function lets you adjust the quality settings of your photos before you capture them. The quality determines the amount of compression applied to your photos. More compression results in a more detailed image. However, the higher the quality, the more memory space is required in your memory card. The available settings for still images are as follows:

Super fine, **Fine**, and **Normal**.



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EV Compensation

EV stands for Exposure Value. In difficult lighting conditions, sometimes the auto exposure function of your camera may not be right for the scene you are capturing. The EV Compensation function allows you to adjust the exposure value and correctly expose your images. Available for still images only.

- To adjust EV settings, press the ◄ or ► keys to increase/ decrease the value. As you adjust the settings, the LCD display changes the image by applying the EV settings. Press the OK button to save and apply changes.
- The available settings are" OEV(Default), -2.0, -1.7, -1.3, -1.0, -0.7, -0.3, +0.3, +0.7, +1.0, +1.3, +1.7 & 2.0 EV

White Balance

The White Balance function allows you to adjust the camera setting according to the light in your scene when recording still images and movies.

• As you move through the selection, you can see the preview on the LCD display.

ISO


The ISO function lets you adjust the ISO sensitivity in recording still images depending on the lighting of your surroundings.

- Use a higher ISO setting in dimly lit lighting conditions and a lower ISO setting in brighter conditions.
- As you move through the selection, you can see the preview on the LCD screen.
- Available settings are: Auto, 50, 100, 200, 400, 800, 1600, and 3200.

Metering

The Metering function lets you select the area of the subject or frame by which the camera measures light to record still images or movies.

As you move through the selection, you can see the preview on the LCD screen.



lcon	Item	Description
[=]	Multi	The camera measures the exposure readings from multiple points in the subject area.
[@]	Center	The camera measures the average light from the entire frame but gives more importance to the values near the center.
[•]	Spot	The camera selects the exposure value based on the center of your picture.

Color Mode

The Color Mode function lets you record still images or movies and apply different colors or tones for a more artistic effect.

• As you move through the selection, you can see the preview on the LCD screen.

• Using the Record Menu

If you are in the Record mode, you can access the Record menu simply by pressing the **MENU** button on your camera. When the menu is displayed, use the 4-way navigation control and the **OK** button to move through menu selections and apply your desired settings. To close the menu anytime, press the **MENU** button again.

Record Menu

The Record menu allows you to change modes, and setup other capture settings.To go to Record Menu:

1. Set the camera to the Record mode.

- 2. Press m to launch the Record Menu.
- Use the ▲ or ▼ keys to move through the menu selections.
- To select an item, press ►.
- Change the submenu settings using the 4-way navigation control.
- Press the OK button to save and apply settings.

Setting the Scene Mode

Setting the Scene mode allows you to capture images with preset settings according to the scenes or environment.

- From the Record Menu, press ► to select the Record Mode.
- 2. Use the navigation controls to move through the selection.
- 3. Press the **OK** button to save and apply changes.

AUTO	Auto	The simplest way to shoot basic images. Settings are adjusted automatically.

When you playback the pictures, there will be an exclamation mark and a triangle to indicate you have pictures with eyes that are closed.You have the opportunity to remove those images with closed eyes.

Enter the scene mode, use the navigation controls to select "Blink Detect" item and press **OK** button to confirm.

Selecting the Photo Stitch Mode

This feature is used for shooting scenery. Use photo stitch to combine your scenic pictures to make one picture or combine different images into one.

Enter to the scene mode, use the navigation controls to select "Photo Stitch " item and press **OK** button to confirm.

Your camera has two important features; Self-timer and Burst that can be set in the Drive mode function in the Record Menu. The Self-timer allows you to take photos after a pre-defined delay. While burst lets you take consecutive shots. This function is only available in recording still images. The Drive mode setting is automatically set to off when vou turn off the camera.

To set the Drive Mode

- 1. From the Record Menu, select the Drive Mode.
- 2. Use the \blacktriangle or ∇ keys to go through the selection.

Setting the Digital Zoom



YouTube Mode

The YouTube Mode allows you to record movies with predefined video settings for easy upload to the YouTube website.

YouTube supports two file upload standards:

- Single File Uploader. The maximum movie file size is up to 100 MB.
- YouTube Uploader. The maximum movie file size is up to 1 GB.

Most uploaded movie length ranges within 5 minutes, although you can upload a maximum movie length of 10 minutes.

Therefore when you record using the YouTube mode, the following standards are used:


- Recorded movies are set to YouTube standard resolution of 640 X 480.
- Recording automatically stops when the file reaches 100 MB.

Recorded movies in the YouTube mode are stored following the DCF rule, however movies are saved in a specific folder named "_UTUBE". For more details, please refer to **"Folder Structure" on page 86**.

• To record a YouTube movie, select from the Movie Size function. Available recording time for a YouTube movie is up to 10 minutes.

• Recording Voices

- From the Record mode menu, select Voice. The Voice Recording screen layout is displayed on the LCD monitor.
- 2. Press the Shutter button to start recording.
- 3. Press the **Shutter** button again to stop recording.





Voice recording will automatically stop when the maximum memory capacity is full.

• Viewing in Single Navigation

The Single navigation mode displays the images one by one on the LCD display. To view images/videos/audio clips, follow the steps below.

- The LCD displays an image. To understand the icons and other information on the screen, please see "Playback Mode Screen Layout" on page 26.

- To play a movie or audio clip, press the ▲ key. See "Playing Movies" on page 57 and "Playing Voice Recording" on page 58 for more details.

• Viewing thumbnails

- 1. Press the III button to view 9-image thumbnails.
- 2. Use the navigation buttons to move through the items.
- 3. Press the **OK** button to select the image and view it normally.



To protect/unprotect a single file:

Image r otated a t 90° clockwise.

- 6. Repeat step 5 until desired orientation is achieved.
- 7. Select Cancel and press the OK button to close Rotation function.



NOTE:

Each time you press the OK button to rotate image, the image is rotated at 90° clockwise.

Trim

The Trim function allows you to trim an image to another image size. This function is only available for still images.

To trim an image:

- 1. Set the camera to Playback mode.
- Use the ◀ or ▶ keys to scroll and select an image to trim.
- 3. Press the **MENU** button to launch the Playback menu.
- 4. Select **Trim**. The Trim screen layout is shown on the LCD display.
- 5. Use the 🚆 control to change size.

Resize

The Resize function allows you to change the image resolution of larger images to smaller ones. This function is only available for still images.

To resize an image:

- 1. Set the camera to Playback mode.
- Use the ◀ or ► keys to scroll and select an image to resize.
- 3. Press the **MENU** button to launch the Playback menu.
- 4. Select **Resize**. The Resize submenu is shown on the LCD display.
- Select size among: 8M, 5M, 3M, and VGA. Available size settings may vary depending on original image size. Unavailable settings appear as grayed out icons in Resize submenu.
- 6. After selecting size, a menu selection appears. Select whether to:
- **Overwrite.** Save and replace the old file with the new one.

Startup Image

The Startup Image function allows you to setup a startup image when you turn on your camera.

DPOF

The Digital Print Order Format (DPOF) function allows you to mark image in your memory card for printing and allows you to specify the number of copies that you want to print at a later date. When all images to be printed are marked, take the memory card to a digital printing service, or use a DPOF compatible printer.

To set DPOF:

- 1. Press the **MENU** button to launch the Playback menu.

PictBridge

The PictBridge function allows you to print images captured by your camera without connecting the camera to a PC. Print images with a PictBridge compatible printer directly.

To activate PictBridge:

Connect your camera to a PictBridge compatible printer using the USB cable. See illustration below.


• About Folder and File Names

Your camera automatically creates specific directory of folders in the internal memory memory cards to organize captured images, videos and audio files.

Folder Structure

Your camera creates three directory names:

- DICAM. All captured images, videos and audio files are stored in this folder except for files recorded using the Auction or YouTube mode.
- _AUCT. Captured images using the Auction mode are saved in this folder.
- **UTUBE.** Captured videos using the YouTube mode are saved in this folder.



Folder names begin with a 3-digit number from 100 to 999 and followed by "DICAM" or "_AUCT" or" UTUBE". Each folder holds up to 9999 files. If new files are saved, a new folder named in sequence will be automatically created.

File Naming

File names begin with "DSCI" and followed by a 4-digit number that increases in sequence. File numbering starts from 0001 when a new folder is created.

If the highest folder number is 999 and the highest file number exceeds 9999, the camera will display the warning message "Folder cannot be created." When this happens, try one of the following ways:

- Reset the file number. See "Setting File Numbering" on page 79.
- Plug in a new memory card.

NOTE:

Do not change the folder and file names in the memory card using your PC. It may be unale to playback the data using the camera.

LCD screen displays 'Format error'.	The memory card is protected. Remove the card and slide the write-protect switch to its unlock position.
