Camera notes:

Insert the Battery and SD/SDHC Card (Not included)

1. Open the battery compartment.



2. Insert the battery while observing the correct polarity. Use the side of battery to press down the stopper as shown, allowing the battery to lock into place properly.







- 3. Insert an SD/SDHC card (not included) into the 4. Close the battery compartment. memory card slot as shown.









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
Optional SD/SDHC cards are not included. The use of 64 MB to 32 GB memory cards from recognized manufacturers such as SanDisk, Panasonic and Toshiba are recommended for reliable data storage.



To remove the SD/SDHC card, open the battery compartment and gently push the card to release it. Pull the card out carefully.

Charging the Battery

- 1. Place the battery into the charger as shown.
- 2. Plug the one end of the connecting cable (plug adapter) into the charger base.
- Plug the other end of the connecting cable into a wall outlet.






Leave the battery charging until the charger light turns green. (To maximize battery life, the first charge should be at least 4 hours)



The charger is for indoor use only.

Turning On and Off

Press the Power button to turn the camera on. To turn off the camera, press the Power button again.



When the camera is turned on, it will default to the the shooting mode last used. You can use the Mode button on the back to change modes. When using the camera for the first-time, the language setup page will appear.

Using the Mode Button

The camera provides a convenient mode button that allows you to switch between different modes easily. After pressing the mode button to enter mode selection menu, press Left/Right button to choose the mode, press "func/OK to select. All the available modes are listed as follows:

The Date/Time and Language setup page will automatically appear when the camera is turned on the first time.

To set the display language and date/time, go to the following setup options in the General Setup menu.

- Language
- Date/Time

To access the General Setup menu, do the following:

- 1. Press the Power button to turn the camera on.
- Press the button, then switch among camera settings menus with the Left/Right button and select the General Setup menu. Then press the Up/Down button to access General Setup menu options.

Setting the Language

- Select language with the Up/Down button, then press the control or right button to enter language options.
- 2. Use the Up/Down/Left/Right buttons to select the desired language.
- 3. Press the $\frac{1}{100}$ button to confirm the setting.

Setting the Date and Time

- Select date/time with Up/Down button, then press the (we) or right button to enter the date/time settings options.
- 2. Use the Left/Right button to select the date or time field, then press the Up/Down buttons to adjust the values.
- 3. Press the $\underbrace{func}{func}$ button to confirm the setting.





About the LCD Screen

When you turn the camera on, various icons are shown on the LCD screen to indicate the current camera settings and status. To learn more about the displayed icons, see "LCD Screen display" on page 25.

LCD Screen notes:

Extremely high-precision technology has been used to manufacture the LCD screen so that most of the pixels are operational for use. However, there may be some minute points (black, white, red, blue or green) that constantly appear on the LCD screen. These points are normal in the manufacturing process and the recorded image is not affected in any way.

Avoid exposing the LCD screen to water; please remove any moisture on the LCD screen with a soft dry cleaning cloth.



If the LCD monitor is damaged, take particular care with the liquid inside the monitor. If any of the following situations arise, take the recommended immediate action indicated below:

- If liquid from the LCD comes in contact with your skin, wipe the area with a cloth and then wash thoroughly with soap and running water.
- If liquid from the LCD flows into the eyes inadvertently, please rinse with water immediately and seek medical assistance.
- If liquid from the LCD is swallowed, flush your mouth thoroughly with water. Drink large quantities of water and induce vomiting. Then seek medical assistance immediately.

BASIC OPERATION

Shooting in Auto Mode 🚇


Auto mode is the easiest mode to take photos. While operating in this mode, the camera automatically optimizes your photos for best results.

To start shooting, do the following:

- 1. Press the Power button to turn the camera on.
- 2. In the Mode menu, select the Auto mode (🤵).
- 3. Compose your picture in the LCD screen and press the Shutter button halfway to focus on the subject.
- 4. The focus frame in the middle of the LCD will turn to green when the subject is properly in focus.
- 5. Press the Shutter button fully to capture the image.

Using the Zoom Function

There are two built-in zoom functions: optical zoom and digital zoom. When taking photos, you can zoom in or out on an object using the zoom wheel.





Zoom indicator (See "Digital Zoom" on page 46)

When the optical zoom reaches its maximum value, it stops momentarily. Release and push the zoom wheel again, and the optical zoom will switch over to digital zoom automatically. After the adjustment, the zoom indication scale hides immediately, and the current zoom status is indicated by the following symbol $\ {\bf Q}$.

Basic Functions Menu

The Basic Function Menus of the camera include Flash, Self-timer, Macro Capture, and Exposure Compensation.

Set the basic functions as per the following steps:

1. Pull up the Basic Function Menus by pressing the Right/Flash button.





- Press the Down button to enter the basic functions selection screen, then press the Left/Right button to select the functions which need to be set.
- 3. Press Up/Down button to enter the basic functions setup screen.



 After pressing Left/Right button to select the options which need to be set, press the (we) button to confirm the setting and quit the screen.

Flash

A Flash: Auto

The flash will fire automatically in low lighting conditions.

- Flash: Red-eye reduction
 - Red eye is caused by the subject looking directly at the flash and the resulting light reflecting off of the retina of the eye. Red eye is eliminated by firing a smaller initial flash prior to the main flash to cause the subject not to look directly at the flash.

- 5 Flash: Forced flash The flash will fire with every shot.
- 50 Flash: Forced off Flash is turned off.
- **\$SL** Flash: Slow Synchro This allows you to take pictures of people at night that clearly show the subject. The shutter is held open longer to allow more light to the image sensor.
- Flash: Red-Eye+Slow Synchro Using this mode for slow synchro shots with red-eye reduction.

Self-timer

- C2 Self-timer: 2 sec A single picture is shot 2 seconds after the Shutter button is pressed.
- C10 Self-timer: 10 sec A single picture is shot 10 seconds after the Shutter button is pressed.
- Coff Self-timer: Off Disables the self-timer.

Macro Mode



Macro: On Select this to focus on subjects 5cm from the lens.

Macro: Off

Select this option to disable Macro mode.

Exposure Compensation

The exposure compensation feature allows you to adjust the light exposure value and control the brightness of the photo.



The adjustable range of exposure value is from EV -2.0 to EV+2.0.

Advanced Functions Menu

The Advanced Functions Menu of the camera include Image Size, Image Quality, White Balance, Image Color and ISO.

Set the advanced functions as follows.

1. Pull up the Advanced Function Menu by pressing the $\frac{f_{\rm unc}}{f_{\rm oc}}$ button.



- Press the Down button to enter the advanced function selection screen, press the Left/Right button to select the function that you want to set.
- 3. Press the Up button to enter the advanced function setting interface.



 Use the Left/Right buttons to change the settings then press the (m) to confirm the new settings and close the Advanced Function Menu.

WB (White Balance)

The White Balance allows you to adjust the color temperature under different lighting conditions. (The WB setting is only available when the camera is in the Manual mode).



The options of White Balance include:

- 🗛 WB: Auto
- 🔆 WB: Daylight
- 📣 WB: Cloudy
- 🕂 WB: Fluorescent
- H= WB: Fluorescent CWF
- -, •- WB: Incandescent
- WB: Manual (Press the shutter button to set WB.)

ISO

The ISO function allows you to set the sensitivity of the camera's sensor to light. To improve the performance in darker environments, a higher ISO value is required. On the other hand, a lower ISO value is needed when in bright conditions. (The ISO setting is only available when the camera is in the Manual mode).

Pictures taken with higher ISO will generally have more noise than those taken with lower ISO.



The options of ISO include automatic, 64, 100, 200, 400, 800, 1600 and 3200.



The available ISO values vary on different camera models.

Quality

The quality setting determines how much the camera compresses the photo files. The higher the compression, the smaller the file size will be, but the quality will decrease. The lower the compression, the larger the file size, but the better the quality.



The three levels of compression are:

- 🛄 : Quality: Best
- 📑 : Quality: Fine
- 🔲 : Quality: Normal

Size

The size setting refers to the image resolution in pixels. A higher image resolution allows you to print that image in larger sizes without degrading the image quality.





The larger the pictures are, the bigger the file sizes are and the less pictures you can store on a memory card.

Color

The color setting option allows you to add artistic effects when taking pictures. You can try different color tones to alter the mood of your pictures. (The Color option is only available when the camera is in the Manual mode).



The color options include:

- JOFF Color: Auto
- **VI** Color: Vivid
- Color: Black & White
- SE Color: Sepia





Auto Scene Mode (ASCN)

In the "ASCN" mode, different conditions are detected intelligently and the most suitable settings will be automatically selected.

To use "ASCN":

 Press mode selection button and select ASCN mode, press the (me) button to enter ASCN mode, the LCD screen will display the detected scene icon as shown in the following figure:



- 2. Hold the camera steadily and aim at the subject. The optimum scene mode will be identified automatically.
- 3. Press the Shutter button halfway down to focus.
- 4. Press the Shutter button all the way down to take the picture.

Landscape Mode

For landscapes, ASCN will automatically adjust the exposure to match the background.

Portrait Mode

For portraits, ASCN will automatically adjust the exposure and skin tones for more natural lokking pictures.

Night Portrait

When you shoot portraits at night, or in low light conditions, ASCN will automatically adjust the exposure for people and night scenes.

Backlit Portrait

When the sun or any other light source is behind you, ASCN will automatically adjust the foreground exposure to produce good pictures.

Night Landscape Mode

For night scenes, ASCN will automatically increase the ISO value to compensate for low light.

Macro Mode

To capture object detail for close-ups, ASCN will automatically adjust the focus.

Auto Mode

The camera automatically adjusts the exposure and focus to ensure good pictures.

Panorama

Panorama mode allows you to create a panoramic picture by stitching together several pictures.

Follow these steps to create a panoramic picture:

- Press the Mode button, use the Left/Right button to select Panorama mode, then press the (we) button to confirm the setting.
- Use the Left/Right button to select the direction of image stitching, e.g. left to right or right to left. Then press the (button to confirm the setting; if no selection is made the camera will default to left to right stitching after 2 seconds.
- 3. After the first shot is taken, two target icons will appear on the left and right side of the LCD screen. Pan the camera and the circle icon on the screen in the specified direction and the circle will move towards the square frame icon. When the circle icon and square frame become green they will overlap, and the camera will capture the next picture automatically. You can repeat this process with up to 8 frames.



- 4. After taking 8 frames, the camera will stitch the images together automatically. Press the Playback button to view the final image.
- After selecting Panorama mode, Flash, Self-timer, Macro mode and Exposure Compensation can't be adjusted.
- After taking a Panoramic picture press the func/ok button to save and exit or press the Delete button to cancel and exit.



In Montage mode, up to 8 photos can be captured when the image size is set at 2MP.

Manual Scene Mode (SCN)

In Manual Scene mode, you can select from a total of 20 scene types to match your needs. You just need to select the right scene for the occasion and the camera will automatically adjust to the optimal settings for you.

Press the Mode button, then use the Left/Right button to enter the Scene Selection mode menu, then press the ()) button to enter Scene Selection mode, the following figure will display on LCD screen:



Select a scene using the Up/Down/Left/Right button and press the $\max_{\rm WC}$ button.

Sport

For fast-moving subjects. Capture sharp action shots without blur.

Indoor

For indoors. Reduce blur and improve color accuracy.

Snow

For snow scenes. Reproduce natural and clear snow scenes.

Fireworks

For fireworks at night. Slow shutter speed adjusted for brilliant images. The use of a tripod is recommended.

Museum

For museum or flash-free areas. Retain color and reduce blur.

Night Landscape

For night scenes. The use of a tripod is recommended.

Children

For kids and pets. Flash is disabled for eye protection.

Leaf

For plants. Capture brilliant shots of greenery and blossoms.

Sunset

For sunsets. Capture subjects in strong sunlight.

Glass

For objects behind transparent glass.

Landscape

For landscapes. Vivid reproduction of green and blue.

Night Portrait

For portraits against night scenery.

Beach

For taking pictures in areas with strong sunlight.

Text

For taking pictures of text or documents or display boards.

Gathering

For taking pictures of people gathering indoors. Photos will appear natural even under difficult lighting conditions.

ID

Ideal to take pictures of documents such as IDs.

Fish eye

For creating interesting image distortion, similar to viewing an image through the eye of a fish.

Travel shooting

Produces background image blur that emphasizes the motion of the main subject.

Photo frame

For adding interesting frame effects to the photo.

Sketch

For taking photos with pencil sketch effect.



- 1. After selecting the scene type, press the two button to activate.
- 2. After setting the option, press the (m) button to confirm the setting and enter the selected Scene Selection mode for shooting.

The main function menu also allows you to adjust the image quality and image size. Please refer to the "Advanced Functions Menu" section on page 21 for detailed instructions.

Blink Detection

Blink Detection is enabled by default unless disabled by the user. When shooting, if a face is detected its eyes closed, the Blink Detection will appear on the screen to show that a blink was detected.




Face Detection

The Face Detection mode will detect and enhance facial features.

- In Shooting Mode, press the Left/Face Detection button to enable the Face Detection and the () will appear on the LCD.
- Hold the camera securely, and point the camera towards the subject to start the face detection process. When the camera detects a face, a white rectangular frame will be drawn around the face. (Note: For best results, the face of the subject should be relatively large on the LCD screen, and the subject should be facing the camera as directly on as possible.)
- 3. Press the **Shutter button** halfway to focus on the subject.
- 4. The frame around the face will turn green when the subject is in focus. Press the Shutter button fully to capture the image.
- 5. Press the Left/Face Detection button to dissable Face Detection.





Smile Detection

With the "Smile Detection" feature, the camera automatically detects and captures a person smiling.

- 1. In Shooting Mode, press the Left/Face Detection button to enable Smile Detection and the () will appear on the LCD.
- Point the camera at the subject until the subject's face is detected and bracketed by a white frame.
 Press the Shutter button completely and then release it. The camera will now 'wait' for the subject to smile.
- When the subject smiles, the camera will automatically and capture the photo.
- 4. To disable the Smile Detection function, press the Left button, or the Shutter button.




A face must be detected by the camera in order for smile detection to function correctly.

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For best results, the subject should be framed to occupy most of the screen space.





Viewing Photos and Videos

To view the captured photos and video clips on the LCD screen:

- Press the
 button to enter the Playback mode.

 The last recorded photo or video clip will appear.
- 2. Use the Left/Right navigation buttons to scroll through the photos or video clips stored in the internal memory or memory card.

Protect

To prevent pictures or videos from being accidentally erased, use this setting to lock one or all of the files.



To protect/unprotect a picture or video:

 Use the Up/Down arrow button and select Protect. then press the (and or Right button to enter the submenu.

- Use the Up/Down button and select "One" to protect individual photos or movies; or select "All" to protect all photos and movies stored in the memory card. Press the web button to confirm and enter the photo/ movie protection interface.
- Press the control button and select Yes to lock displayed photos or videos, or select Unprotect to unlock them, then press the Up/Down button and select Back to return to the playback menu.

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Selecting "reset" will un-protect all previously protected photos and videos.

DPOF (Digital Print Order Format)

Trim

The Trim setting allows you to trim an area of a selected photo and save it as a new photo.







Connect Your Camera to an HDMITV to View Videos

HDMI (High Definition Multimedia Interface), is a fully digital audio/video transmission interface, through which uncompressed audio and video signals are transmitted.

Direct transmission of digital video signals to your TV reduces conversion loss and improves image quality.



Connecting the camera to an HDMITV

- 1. Use a high-definition output terminal cable (optional) to connect your camera to an HDMI compliant TV.
- 2. The camera will automatically determine if the connected display supports 1080i resolution. If the display supports the resolution, select the resolution you prefer in the menu shown on the camera and the monitor will display the images at the specified resolution. If the monitor does not support the resolution, it will automatically display images at the highest resolution possible.
- 3. Once an output format is selected, the LCD screen in the camera will go blank (although it is still on) and your TV will then display the images and menus.

Note that your camera and TV should be turned off before connecting them.

Refer to your TV instruction manual for information on what resolution sizes it will support. The resolution and output formats that are not supported will be grayed out on the camera's LCD screen.

Connecting to a PC

Use the USB cable supplied with your camera to copy (transfer) pictures to a computer.

Setting the USB Mode

Since the camera's USB port can be set to connect with either a PC or a Printer, the following steps will ensure that the camera is correctly configured to connect with a PC. The USB mode is set to PC by default.

- Enter the Transmission menu and select USB Mode with the Up/Down button, then press the (w) or Right button to enter.
- 2. Use the Up/Down navigation buttons and select PC.
- 3. Press the $\underbrace{\text{we}}$ button to confirm the setting.




Transferring Files to Your PC

The computer will automatically detect the camera as a removable drive. Double-click the **My Computer** icon on the desktop to locate the removable drive and to copy the folders and files in the drive to a directory on your PC as you would copy any other folder or file.

By using the USB cable, you can transfer the captured photos and videos to a PC. Follow the steps below to connect the camera to a PC.

- 1. Make sure both the camera and PC are turned on.
- 2. Connect one end of the supplied USB cable to the USB/AV OUT port on your camera.
- 3. Connect the other end of the cable to an available USB port on your PC.



4. Disconnect the camera once the transfer is completed.


